

April 23, 2023 OPENING QUESTION

What do we mean when we say "believe in yourself?" What does it mean to *believe* something, or believe in something?

The Apostles' Creed is a concise declaration of the Christian faith, an easy to memorize a confession of common belief. For centuries, it has helped people from all denominations of Christianity know and remember what they believe. Throughout the stories of the Bible, we can see how God's people get into trouble (sin, injustice, captivity) when they forget who their God is and what He has done. We are no different; creeds help us to remember what we believe – not generically, but specifically - so that we remember Whose we are, and therefore who we are.

DISCUSS

What is the difference between knowing and believing?

• If an outsider evaluated you on your actions alone, what would they say that you believe? (This doesn't have to only include things we believe about our faith in God! If you're stuck, think about your knowledge and beliefs around nutrition or exercise.)

As we begin to consider the Apostles' Creed, take some moments as a group to read through the creed (at the right). Knowing that we'll be looking at the whole thing in depth over the next four weeks, discuss:

- What confuses you or you feel unsure about (without judgment or the need to correct).
- What you confidently believe.
- What stands out to you about the structure or content.

This week, we'll dig into the first section on God, the Father Almighty. There are verses below (detailed at the right) to help you consider these titles.

- What associations and descriptions come to mind when you hear Father?
- What associations and descriptions come to mind when you hear Almighty? (You may need to define that word as a group!)
- Do you find it hard or easy to *believe* that both things are always true about God?

What actions in your daily life would reveal your belief in God as Father?

• What actions would reveal your belief in His all-powerfulness?

As a group, discuss what it means that God is the Creator.

- How is God's creating work similar to and different from our own creative works?
- What do Psalm 24:1, 19:1-4 and Revelation 4:11 add to your understanding of what it means that God is the Creator of heaven and earth?

How is *knowing* that God is the Creator of heaven and earth different than *believing* He is the Creator?

• What thoughts, attitudes, and actions might show up in your life if you *believe* God is our Creator?

As we began this series studying the Apostles' Creed, Dirk talked about how a tool like the Creed keeps our belief broad and balanced.

As you read through the creed, what does it bring up that will help your perspective stay broader than our western, 21st century lenses?

What areas of the creed will help to bring balance to your belief? In other words, in which areas do you feel like your understanding and belief are weaker?

Dirk gave several balanced pairs that help us to consider where our belief may have become unbalanced. For each of the following pairs, consider: which side is easier for you to lean toward, and how can you grow in your understanding and love of it's pair?

- Mighty Creator and merciful Father
- Infinitely above and intimately close
- Beyond comprehension and right there beside me

Where do you see God's Fatherliness in the passage? Where do you see His Almightiness?

CLOSE WITH PRAYER

Pray for one another over the needs in your hearts and lives. Ask God to help you believe, and to help your life evidence your beliefs.

Reminders for the week ahead:

1 John 3:1See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

Romans 8:14For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. 15For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" 16The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,
